### Honouring our Year 12 Graduates

But, for me one of the best moments for our Year 12 students will be on Thursday when we do the Guard of Honour parade and walkout. This event is totally about the Year 12's. They run the event, they speak at the event and then every other member of our school community gets to congratulate and celebrate with them as they walk past the guard of honour to the schools main Quad.

### Normal Operations for Years 7 to 11

Although there is much going on for our Year 12 cohort it is important that we remember that the rest of the school are continuing their hard work towards their end of year assessment. All students will be finished their assessment by the end of week 8 when our Year 10 and 11 students finish for the year. Our Junior students will be part of our annual alternate

program for the last two weeks which has a focus on student engagement, learning and fun.

### Facilities

## Year 10 Update

### Exam Block – Week 7

Year 10 students will commence block exams next week from Monday, 15 November until Friday, 19 November. Students are only required to attend school for their scheduled exams.

### Futures Week – Week 8

Southport State High Independent Public will be providing all Year 10 students the opportunity to participate in 'Futures Week' in week 8, the final week for senior student. This five-day program will take place from Monday, 22 November until Friday, 26 November 2021.

This alternate learning programs provides opportunities for students to develop their employability skills, explore possible career options, understand employer expectations, improve literacy and numeracy skills and reflect on their current pathway.

All Year 10 students will be required to participate in one of five programs:

- Australian Business Week
- Work Experience
- Certificate I Financial Services
- Cert II Foundation Skills in Work Readiness
- Certificate II Sampling

The alternate learning programs aim to build productive relationships while engaging each individual with the school and wider community values of Teaching and Learning, Ourselves, Responsible Relationships and Our Community.

All year 10 students should have now selected which program they will be participating in and have been given the respective notes and paperwork to be completed and returned ASAP. Please ensure your child has returned their signed permission note to school for this program.

## Year 11 Update

### Exam Block – Week 8

Year 11 students will commence block exams during week 8 of this term from Monday, 22 November until Friday, 26 November. All timetabled lessons will conclude for the Year 11 cohort on Friday, 19 November. Students are only required to attend school for their scheduled exams.

Students who have an exam scheduled during this week have been provided with a copy of their individual exam timetable. All Unit 3 and 4 exams and assignments are summative pieces of assessment and count towards a student final result, QCE points and ATAR score.

Support sessions will be provided during Year 11 block exams for students who are not up to date with assessment, traineeships and certificate courses. In the week prior to the block exam period, parents and students will receive notification if they will be required to attend school to attend support sessions. Students are required to attend school from 9am – 2:55pm each day of the block exam period to complete tasks in the Learning Hub. They are to also attend any scheduled exams during this time.

Firstly, a huge congratulations to our Year 12 students for completing their external examinations and certificate courses. This is a fantastic achievement and we are proud of their hard work and efforts to ensure they are on track to achieve success.

## Absences for Exam Block

Term 4 is now halfway over and we are very busy.

This term is full of school events and school celebrations. I recently attended the REEL Awards (Film and Media) at the

Australia Fair Cinemas. This was a fantastic venue that was able to showcase on the big screen the quality work of our students. It was great to see so many parents and staff there also. It is a credit to our teaching staff that we can run such a professional event.

Our school is involved in a very productive partnership with our closest primary schools called the Southport Learning Precinct. This partnership is very valuable as this gives us the opportunity to work with our future students before they come to us in Year 7. We will be conducting a School Belonging Survey with all Year 6 (2021) students and then again in Year 7 (2022). This will provide Southport and the primary schools with information about student transition and school experience. We will also be working on a common project in 2022 with the SLP related to improving student outcomes across the four schools involved.

This term we have been working hard particularly in the morning with our students ensuring that students are in uniform, wearing hats, ready to learn and punctual to school. The majority of our students were already complying with this daily but we have high expectations at Southport so we have been further supporting some students to improve their standards related to these important cultural behaviours. As discussed in previous newsletter, parents can assist by checking each night that your child is ready to go to school the next day in terms of their uniform, equipment, device (fully charged), having a good sleep, breakfast and being on time to school. This allows everyone to focus upon learning rather than other distractions. We have been offering positive rewards to students who are doing the right thing. One of these initiatives starts this week with the pool being open each day at 1st break for Year 7's.

As per usual our Attendance this term is more important than ever and we want every student to **be at school every day** if possible. We want to finish the year strongly with students attending every day, learning and having fun.

## 2022 Year 7 Orientation

It's hard to believe that we are already over half way through Term 4 with only 4 weeks to go. As we draw closer to the end of the year, our focus begins on the next cohort of students joining us in 2022. In Week 9, we welcome the incoming Year 7s to school for their days of orientation. This is a great opportunity for students to experience life as a student at Southport State High before they transition to the school in 2022. Please note, this Orientation is only available to students that have already completed their enrolment paperwork and enrolment interviews. ## 2021 Alternate Program

In Weeks 9 and 10, Junior Secondary students will be completing an Alternate Program. What happens is a different faculty oversees the teaching and learning for each year level across the last ten school days. This program will run from Monday 29 November to Friday 10 December. It is expected that all Year 7, 8 and 9 students attend up until the last day of Term 4 (Friday 10 December). An outline of the program for each day will be out to parents in the coming weeks.

## Punctuality and Attendance

Teaching and learning time is precious. Each subject has three 70-minute lessons per week and missing classes or being late means precious learning time is impacted. The following quote reinforces the importance of punctuality for life not just school, "early is on time and on time is late".

Attendance and punctuality are important life skills that students can control. Making it to class on time and ready to learn contributes to their overall learning progress and performance. The following table summarises how missing learning time can affect long term learning.

Just a little bit late doesn't seem much

He/She is only missing just ...	That equals ...	Which is ...	And over 13 years of schooling that is ...
10 minutes/ day	50 minutes / week	Nearly 1.5 weeks/ year	Nearly ½ a year
20 minutes/ day	1 hour 40 minutes/ week	Over 2.5 weeks/ year	Nearly 1 year
30 minutes/ day	½ a day/ week	4 weeks/ year	Nearly 1 ½ years

## Learning Management System, QLearn

In Mid 2022 Southport State High School will move into a new Learning Management System, QLearn.

## The QLearn Early Adopter Stage Has Concluded

Canvas has been announced as the new enterprise Learning Management System (LMS) for the Department of Education and Training. The new LMS will be named QLearn. QLearn will replace eLearn, the current LMS for the department and go live Mid 2022.



Southport State High School has partaken in the Early Adopter Implementation (EAI), which commenced in early March.

This has provided the school with the opportunity to become familiar with the new platform. There were 74 schools with a total of 318 participants taking part in EAI across the state. The early adopters undertook an important and crucial role by being one of the first to explore the capabilities of our new LMS.

The feedback from regarding the QLearn platform has been resoundingly positive. QLearn will provide a modernised LMS with an intuitive interface to further support student learning. The platform is supported across various platforms including iPads and laptops and provides integration with Microsoft Learning Tools including Immersive Reader.
